
# Future Message Series

# An Opportunity to Fight World **Poverty and Spread the Gospel**

FMC likes to do its small part to fight world poverty and present the gospel while doing so. We have been asked to partner with Solar Clutch of Fort Wayne and Disciple Makers from Somalia who are working in an underground church in the horn of Africa. The Disciple Makers are converts from Islam in a refugee camp of 1,500 people.

Solar Clutch makes solar cookers - the cookers are made in Fort Wayne and used around the world with outreach projects. Fellowship Missionary Church in Fort Wayne partners with this group. It is all run by World Partners missionaries. World Partners is the overseas missions arm of the Missionary Church. The goal is \$6,000 or any part of it we can provide. This week, October 14, we will have a special opportunity to partner with Solar Clutch.

# **Update from The Next Step Fund Committee**

Greetings congregation. Over the last few weeks the Next Step Fund committee has participated in a couple of presentations from ministry organizations that administer the type of loans we are trying to make available to third world folks trying to get out of poverty. We recently committed to funding several projects through the CMF Big Dent program as well as through Open Doors. These organizations fund projects in places like Nairobi, Kenya, and other similar locations. We are awaiting specifics around these projects and are excited about this ministry opportunity. As we get information and updates on how these projects are progressing, we will get you specifics. Please keep these recipients and their families in your prayers. The committee also requests your prayers as we try to make decisions around the funds you have made available. We want to do the right thing and honor God in our decisions.

Bethlehem Marketplace (BMP) is only 7 weeks away! Sign up begins next Sunday.

2012 marks our 23rd year. There is a booklet in the literature rack that explains this Bridge Event ministry and why we do it.

- 2. Be in prayer for your participation. Be in prayer for the 3,000+ that God will bring to experience what the streets of Bethlehem the day after Christ was born, must have been like.

Approximately 3,000+ people come through the streets each year and 75% are first-timers. The prayer and goal is to help them become first time and regular attenders on Sunday mornings too.

# A Prayer For Our Nation The Road to National Revival


- 1. We must reconnect with God.

# Why are Solar Cookers Needed?

- 1. Half the world's population of 6 billion cooks over wood fires.
- 2. The United Nations estimates that 2 billion now suffer from *fuel wood shortage*.
- 3. Solar cooking offers an alternative to deforestation of valuable trees.
- 4. Women and children must spend increasingly more time finding wood thus keeping them from *equal opportunity* in their societies.
- 5. Some urban families spend 30-50% of their income on cooking fuel or must barter away food for fuel.
- 6. World Health Organization estimates 80% of all illnesses are spread through contaminated water. Solar cookers are also used to pasteurize water and milk.
- 7. Burning traditional fuels such as wood and gas *pollutes the air* and contributes to global warming. Solar cookers provide a pollution-free alternative.
- 8. In underdeveloped areas many respiratory illnesses are cause by smoke from cooking fires.

We are partnering with a Somali refugee camp in Somali Land. There are 1500 families that have fled from the fighting in other parts of Somalia. Food is being supplied on a small scale by aid workers. The women have had exposure to solar cookers and are now asking to have their own. Would you like to be a part of this effort to give each woman a solar cooker?
