Residents of Steuben County,

We have all heard about the proposed strip club wanting to come to Angola and we have all asked, what can I do to stop it?

I am thankful for our local leaders who are doing everything within their legal powers to make it very unappealing for the club to locate here. They cannot legally say, get out of town. I suggest all of us do three things to help stop the club: Sign it, show up, and pray.

- 1. Sign a petition asking the Alcoholic Beverage Board of Steuben County to deny the transfer of the liquor license to the club. Any Steuben County resident, 18 years old and over, can sign the petition. Download it online, take it to work, to your neighbors, church, club, everywhere, to give every resident of Steuben County the opportunity to sign it. If they know about it, everyone will sign it. Please return petitions to me by Tuesday, November 27.
- 2. I invite everyone to show up at the meeting of the Alcoholic Beverage Board of Steuben County on Wednesday, November 28, 1:00 p.m. at the Court House Annex in Angola. Anyone of any age from anywhere can come and show their support to deny the liquor license transfer. People in Ohio and Michigan, you are asked to come because people from your communities will come to the club. South Bend, Fort Wayne, Auburn, LaGrange, Kendallville, you come. Everyone that is free, come. Mothers and babies and children, university students, high school government classes, every club of any type, come. Everyone of all ages in Steuben County, come. Take a late lunch and come. Even if you sign the petition, still come to this meeting. Wednesday, November 28, 1:00 p.m, Angola Courthouse Annex.
- 3. I ask you to pray. On this issue we fight not against flesh and blood but we fight against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms and these type fights are only ever fought with prayer.

Residents of Steuben County, I urge all of us to do all we can to make it very unappealing for the strip club to come to Angola. Sign it, show up, and pray.


purchase. Presently we have \$9,895 toward our half of the purchase price. Thank you for your generous giving!

- 2. The Deacons and Church Leadership Team (Church Board) will review the names and possibly interview candidates and select 3 individuals to fill these openings.
- 3. The congregation will be asked to ratify these selections at the Annual Business Meeting on January 20, 2013, at 6:00 p.m.

Deacons must be members of the church in good standing. The complete church membership list and Deacons job description are available at the connection center.
