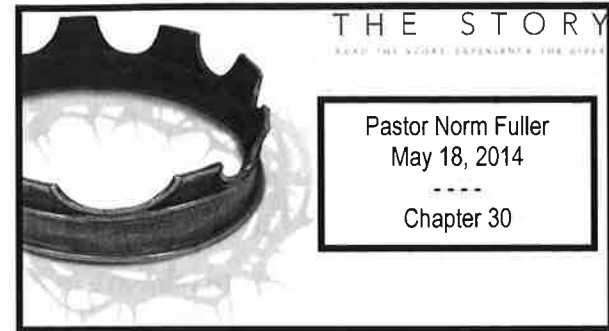

Church Building News

A large portion of the church's roof needs to be replaced. The Trustees have received a bid of \$70,000 to do 23,100 sq. ft., or approximately one half, of the roof. This is the part of the roof that was put on in 1985, 1992, and some in 2000. The bid is from Hydrotech Building Solutions, owned by FMC attendee Wade Stiefken. Wade has been in the roofing business for 20 years. The Trustees reviewed the bid carefully and find it to be a very good price for the extensive work and quality of roof being put on. The roof will be an asphalt roof with a 40 year warranty. The goal is to have \$50,000 in hand before they start. Your generous, special gift toward this project is welcome. A Trip With Pastor Norm

Purpose: Fun and to get to know some FMC folks you may not know.

When: Saturday, June 7, we will leave FMC at 6:30 am and return around 6 pm, we hope.

Where: At the Fair Oaks Farms which is 3 hours west of here in Fair Oaks, Indiana.

NEW INFORMATION → **Cost:** Admission to the farm is free because of a generous gift to cover admission to the farm. The cost is only \$10.00 for gasoline and whatever you spend for lunch at the Fair Oaks Farms Café where they serve products and produce fresh from the farm plus money to buy ice cream and cheese, etc. to bring home in the coolers we will provide. **Information:** Fair Oaks is one of the top agri-tour destinations in the nation with 35,000 cows (we will see only 2,000-3,000), a 72 cow milking carousel and a birthing facility (80-100 calves are born each day) where we can watch the miracle of life. The pig adventure is a one-of-a-kind in the world with 80,000 piglets born every year - we can visit their birthing facility too. The touring part of the pig farm is all enclosed in glass with its separate air conditioning system. Why? Not to keep the smell of the pigs away from us but to keep our germs away from the pigs. 500,000 people tour the farm each year. **Limited to the first 14 people** to sign up at the Connection Center.
