The theme of this year's musical is the Lamb of God, a strand that runs throughout the history of the Bible. It can be traced all the way back to Abraham and his son, Isaac, and Abraham's obedience to God. To God's deliverance of the children of Israel in Egypt and their 40 years in the wilderness. To Jesus whom John called, "The Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!".

The musical paints a picture of Jesus the Lamb of God and what He did for the world on the cross and through the empty tomb. Through powerful drama and music we learn and are impacted by Jesus and the effect He had on people who met Him and walked with Him. We also are presented the opportunity to interact with Him today.

Some items to help make the musical more enjoyable for all of us:

- ♦ There is activity in the aisles during the musical cast entering and leaving. If you must leave the sanctuary, the ushers are instructed to intercept you upon your return so you do not get hurt by the cast coming and going. During total blackouts the sanctuary is pitch black and it is impossible to see others.
- No whispering or talking, please. A noise on one side of the sanctuary is easily heard on the other side. The sanctuary is acoustically perfect so sound travels very clearly.
- Children age 3 and under are welcome in the nursery and toddler rooms. If you must leave the sanctuary with a noisy child, the ushers can direct you to the nursery, where your child can remain for the rest of the program. You will be allowed back into the sanctuary at the ushers' timing so as not to be "run over" by the cast in the aisles or disrupt the musical.
- Cell phones/electronic devices: Please turn off your electronic device - completely off. Why? When you look at your screen, others around you look at your screen too, and they miss what is happening on stage or in the aisles. A cell phone ringing can be heard in the entire sanctuary and can disrupt the most holy moments. No texting, no pictures, no reading a novel on your Kindle, etc.
- Most of the songs in the musical will have words on the screen. If you are familiar with the songs, you are welcome to sing along with the vocalists.
- ◆ To applaud or not to applaud is always a question that is difficult to answer. We encourage applauding when you feel moved by a certain song. Some scenes will require a holy hush as the appropriate response. Applauding is the "Amen" of this generation.

How to Know God

You were designed to know God in a personal way - to have a relationship with Him, through His Son, Jesus Christ. How do you start a relationship with God?

Jesus still offers eternal life to everyone who believes on his name. Here are five words that explain what it means to have a personal relationship with Jesus.

Sin - Romans 3:23- for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

Do you believe everyone sins? Sin leads to something.

Death - Romans 6:23- For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The wages of sin is death. What everybody earns is death and sin leads to death.

Love - Romans 5:8- But God demonstrates His own love oward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

God demonstrated His love for us by putting his son Jesus on the cross. Why? So that sin and death can be taken away.

Faith - Ephesians 2:8-9 8- For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; 9 not as a result of works, so that no one may boast.

We are only saved through faith and we can only receive it as a free gift from God.

Life – Romans 10-9-10 9- that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; 10 for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.

When you believe in your heart and confess in Jesus and his resurrection you will be saved. You will become a citizen of heaven.

Is there anything or anyone keeping you from receiving the free gift of life in Jesus today? If you understand these verses, believe in the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus, and you are willing to speak these truths with your mouth, the gift of life in Jesus will be yours. Simply tell God that you receive His forgiveness for the sins in your life. Tell Him thanks for the free gift of life through His Son, Jesus. Now is the time to embrace Jesus as Lord and Savior of your life.

"Lord I know I'm a sinner, but I thank
You for Your Son, Jesus, who died on the
cross for my sin and rose on the third day
so that my sins could be forgiven and I
can be with You forever. Thank You for
loving me. I'm ready to follow You and
give my life to You. Please help me along
the way and allow me to know You better
each day. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen."

The Crucifixion

It would be impossible for any cantata to accurately portray the flogging and crucifixion of our Lord. During the flogging our Lord was tied hand and foot to a low stump - about knee high, and whipped with leather straps that had bone, metal or lead sewn into the ends of them. This whipping was called "Half-way Death" by the Romans. During this, Jesus never once retaliated - not even a word spoken.

Crucifixion was devised by the Persians who believed in Ormuzd - the earth god. To them the earth was sacred and a criminal was not allowed to touch the sacred earth when he died. Thus the criminal was suspended above the earth, by crucifixion, to die. The Romans perfected crucifixion into an art.

Sometimes the victim would stay on the cross for days before he died - usually death was by suffocation, not the loss of blood. The victim would suffocate because he no longer had the strength to pull himself up to get air into his lungs.

Talking while on the cross was one of the most difficult things to do - thus the words of our Lord are more meaningful.

Often victims were not buried but just hung there until the birds and animals devoured their bodies.

Our Lord was buried because the Sabbath was coming in three hours and it was against Jewish law to keep the body on the cross over the Sabbath.

Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
