

Lee was a true servant here at Fairview whether he was doing dishes after one of our meals, ushering on Sunday mornings, or singing in the Easter musical.

Lee loved singing in the Easter Musical but he also was passionate about how the set looked. He helped build props, paint, repair. Lee knew what needed to be done and was ready to jump in and complete whatever was asked of him.

One task I specifically remember is the repair of our rock cloth. As you look at the set you will see it covering the area around the cross and the steps by the tomb. A few years ago I told Lee that we needed to make new rock cloth or repair the old. He immediately jumped in and led the tedious process of repairing the cloth. Many hours with glue, paint, and paper went in to repairing it so the set would look great.

This year as we constructed the set, placed the rock cloth, and built the props we thought of Lee. We know he would have been serving right beside us working hard, but God's plan for him was different. This Easter he will be singing in heaven with his Savior, Jesus Christ. This year we begin our annual Easter Production with the most important question Jesus asked. A question that resonates through history. "Who Do You Say I Am?" With a cast of all ages we use drama and music to share the stories of five people who were impacted by Jesus, who all had to answer that question. Simon Peter's answer was "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." In the end all of us have to answer the question Jesus asked His disciples: "Who Do You Say I Am?".

My prayer is as you watch the dramas and listen to the music you will begin to sort out your own answer to that question. Who do you say Jesus is? Do you interact with Him each day? I am here to say He is someone that can be a part of your daily life.

This is my 16th year directing the production which couldn't have happened without the assistance of Cindy Cairl, Liz Scofield, Jan Pettigrew (costumes and props) Karla Dobson (leading the children and teen choreography), and Beth Stepp (band director).

Rehearsals for this year's production began in January with the drama, musical and technical cast spending close to 50 hours of rehearsal time learning the songs, drama, choreography and technical cues. Children and teens play an important part in this year's production. Of the 89 people in the cast and crew involved, 33 of them are between the ages of 6 weeks and 18 years. The cast is excited to share the death and resurrection of Jesus in a unique and powerful way. Thank you so much for coming.

Some items to help make the musical more enjoyable for all of us:

- There is activity in the aisles during the musical cast entering and leaving. If you must leave the sanctuary, the ushers are instructed to intercept you upon your return so you do not get hurt by the cast coming and going. During total blackouts the sanctuary is pitch black and it is impossible to see others.
- No whispering or talking, please. A noise on one side of the sanctuary is easily heard on the other side. The sanctuary is acoustically perfect so sound travels very clearly.
- Children age 3 and under are welcome in the nursery and toddler rooms. If you must leave the sanctuary with a noisy child, the ushers can direct you to the nursery, where your child can remain for the rest of the program. You will be allowed back into the sanctuary at the ushers' timing so as not to be "run over" by the cast in the aisles or disrupt the musical.
- Cell phones/electronic devices: Please turn off your electronic device - completely off. Why? When you look at your screen, others around you look at your screen too, and they miss what is happening on stage or in the aisles. A cell phone ringing can be heard in the entire sanctuary and can disrupt the most holy moments. No texting, no pictures, no reading a novel on your Kindle, etc.
- Most of the songs in the musical will have words on the screen.
 If you are familiar with the songs, you are welcome to sing along with the vocalists.
- To applaud or not to applaud is always a question that is difficult to answer. We encourage applauding when you feel moved by a certain song. Some scenes will require a holy hush as the appropriate response. Applauding is the "Amen" of this generation.

How to Know God

Love - Romans 5:8- But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

God demonstrated His love for us by putting his son Jesus on the cross. Why? So that sin and death can be taken away.

Faith - Ephesians 2:8-9

8- For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; 9- not as a result of works, so that no one may boast.

We are only saved through faith and we can only receive salvation as a free gift from God.

Life – Romans 10:9-10- that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; 10 for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.

When you believe in your heart and confess in Jesus and his resurrection you will be saved. You will become a citizen of heaven.

Is there anything or anyone keeping you from receiving the free gift of life in Jesus today? If you understand these verses, believe in the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus, and you are willing to speak these truths with your mouth, the gift of life in Jesus will be yours. Simply tell God that you receive His forgiveness for the sins in your life. Tell Him thanks for the free gift of life through His Son, Jesus. Now is the time to embrace Jesus as Lord and Savior of your life.

"Lord I know I'm a sinner, but I thank
You for Your Son, Jesus, who died on the
cross for my sin and rose on the third day
so that my sins could be forgiven and I
can be with You forever. Thank You for
loving me. I'm ready to follow You and
give my life to You. Please help me along

each day. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen."
